

# **“99 Ways To Speak Spanish Right Now!”**

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The US Army Special Forces (Green Berets), it's mandatory that all Special Forces soldiers attend a language school and learn a language orientated towards the Special Forces Group they are assigned. Each Special Forces Group is assigned a particular part of the world.

For example, 7<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group, their Area of Operations is Central America, South America and immediate surrounding areas. So 7<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group sends their Special Forces soldiers to schools to learn languages like Spanish, Portuguese, French, Dutch,...

My languages when assigned to 7<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group was Spanish and French when I was assigned to 5<sup>th</sup> Special Forces Group (see Blog Post below to learn some French like right now).

So with all the language training and experiences with Spanish, I'd thought I'd share it with you.

The “99 Ways To Speak Spanish Right Now!” is taken directly from my Survival Book - **“How To Learn Spanish Fast!” - 3,399 Ways To Speak Spanish Instantly!**

OK, let's start learning some Spanish like right now.

Below, on the left-side are the Spanish words with their translation and on the right is how to pronounce it.

On the right of each Spanish word is the spelled-out phonetic version. PRETEND you're speaking it out in English so to pronounce it in Spanish. Like the Spanish word 'Algo.' Algo means 'something.' To pronounce it, say the 02 words 'All Go.' Good, you just said the word 'something' in Spanish.

OK, here are several more examples before we start some simple common everyday Spanish sentences.

**1<sup>st</sup> Note:** When you see words CAPITALIZED segments, that means it is accented. Say it harder, say it louder than the rest of the word.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Note:** The letter 'r' had a d sound to it. But even if you don't prounounce the 'd' sound, don't worry, they'll still understand you.

Agua (water) = Ah gwa

Algo (something) = all go

Alguien (anybody, somebody) = all gee en

Anteojos (eye glasses) = on tay oh hos

Armas (firearms, weapons) = ar mas

Atrás (back, behind) = ah TRAS

Beber (to drink) = bay bair

Buscando (looking for) = boo skawn dough

Caballo (horse) = caw by yo

Café (coffee) = kaw FAY

Cálmate (you calm down) = CALL maw tay

Camarones (shrimp) = caw maw rohn ness

Casa (house) = caw saw

Cerca (near) = sare kaw

Chico (kid, boy) = chee koh

Comer (to eat) = Koe mare

Connmigo (with me) = kohn me go

Cuchillo (knife) = koo chee oh

Dame (give me) = daw may

Déjame (leave me, let me) = DAY haw may

Día (day) = DEE ah

Diablo (devil, hell) = dee ah blow

Dios (God) = dee ohs

Docena (dozen) = dough say naw

Enviaste (did you send) = en vee ah stay

Fuego (fire) = fway go

Gato (cat) = gaw thow

Gente (people) = hen tay

Gracias (thank you) = graw see ahs

Hablaste (did you talk) = ha blah stay

Haciendo (doing) = haw see n dow

Helado (frozen, cold, ice cream) = hay law dough

Hueso (bone) = way so

Langosta (lobster) = lawn go stah

LLamar (to call) = yah mar

Lo siento (I'm sorry, I feel it)  
= low see n tow

Mal (bad) = mall

Me (me) = (may)

Mi (my) = mee

Mujer (woman) = moo hair

Nada (nothing) = naw daw

Nadar (to swim) = naw dar

Nadie (nobody) = naw dee a

Oso (bear) = oh so

Ocupado (busy, occupied) = Ah coo paw dough

Padre (father) = paw dray

Pan (bread, toast) = pawn

Película (movie) = pay LICK oo lah

Perro (dog) = paydd dooh (roll the ddd sound)

Pistola (pistol) = pee stow lah

Pobre (poor) = poh bray

Por fin (finally, at last) = poor feen

Preguntaste (you asked, questioned) = pray goon  
tah stay

Puedo (I can) = pway dough

Respirar (to breathe) = ress pee dar

Salchichas (hot dog, sausage) = sal chee chaws

Sólo. (alone) = SO low

Soy (I am) = soy (as in soy bean)

Teléfono (telephone) = the LEY foe know

Tenemos (we have) = tay nay mohs

Tengo (I have) = tango (as in dancing)

Trabajo (work. I work) = trah baw hoe)

Tuviste (you've had) = too vee stay

Vamos (we go, let's go) = vah mos

Vinimos (we came) = vee nee mos

Now that you had a taste of pronouncing some Spanish words, here are 99 every day common Spanish sentences. Fire! Everybody get out!----Fuego! Salgan todos!

Follow me.-----Síganme.

Forget about it.-----Olvídaloo.

From time to time.-----De vez en cuando.

Get the hell out.-----Vete de aquí.

Get out of my way!-----Fuera de mi camino!

Give me that.-----Dame eso.

Go back to work.-----Vete a trabajar.

God bless you.-----Dios te bendiga.

Good afternoon.-----Buenas tardes.

Good luck.-----Buena suerte.

Good morning!-----Buenos días!

Good night.-----Buenas noches.

Good question.-----Buena pregunta.

Go this way.-----Vaya usted por aquí.

Go to hell.-----Vete al diablo.

Hang on a minute.-----Un momento.

Haven't seen you in a while.--Tanto tiempo.

Have you seen any  
good movies?-----¿Has visto alguna película buena?

He died.-----Se murió.

Not so fast.-----No tan de prisa.


No way!-----No puede ser!
